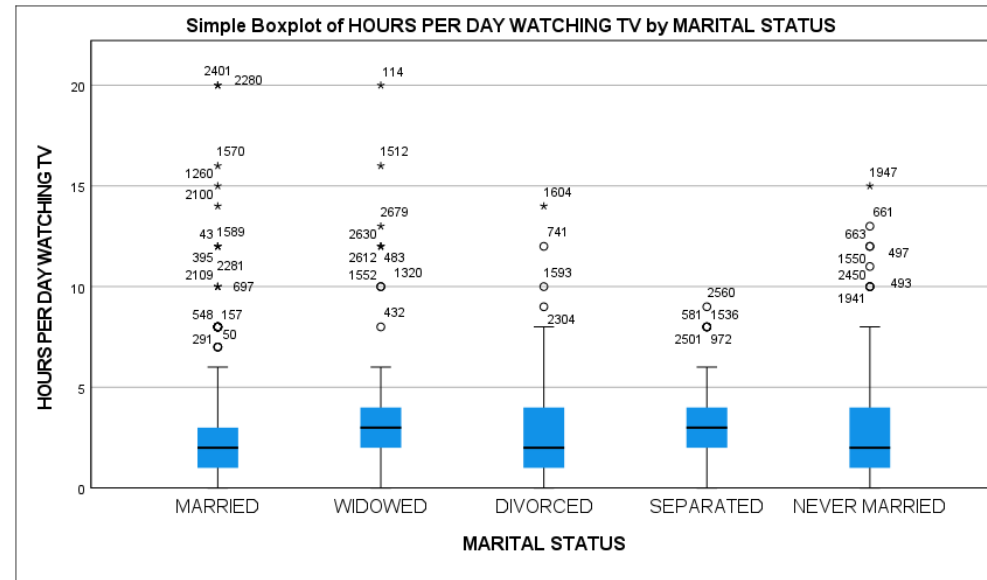

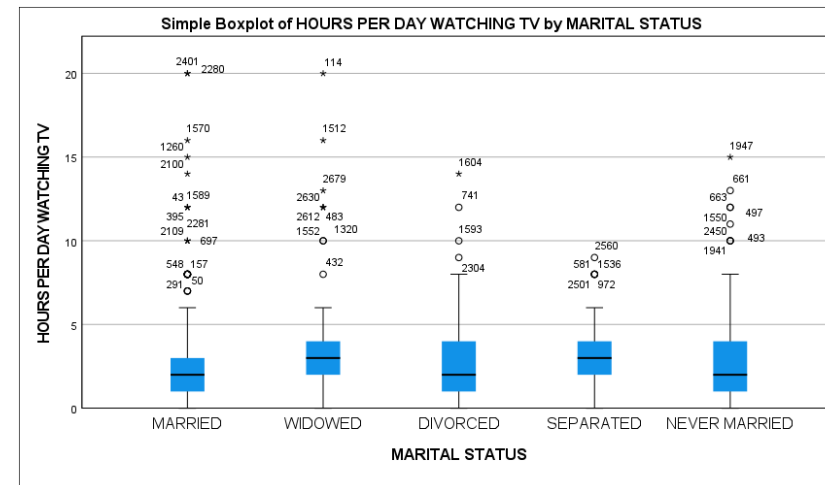
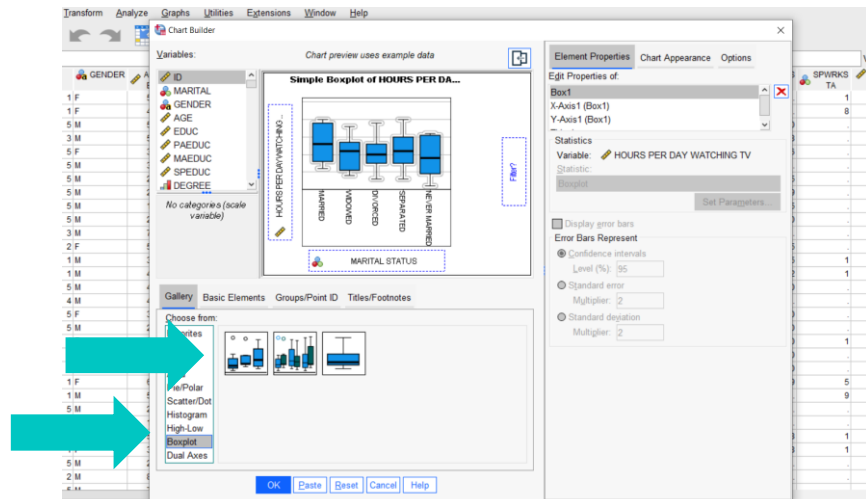
Tech Tips – Quick Box Plots

- **Did you know that you can easily run box plots from the Graphs menu in IBM SPSS Statistics?**
- Box plots are a visual summary of data and a way to check for outliers.



Tech Tips – Quick Box Plots

- To quickly run a box plot go to the **Graphs** menu and select **Chart Builder**.
- In this example we are comparing TV hours across categories of Marital Status.
- Select Boxplot from the **Choose from** options and select **Simple Boxplot**. In this example we want to examine tv watching across categories of marital status. Drag **Marital** on the X axis and **TV Hours** on the Y axis. Click **OK**. You then have your boxplot in an output file.
